ORDINANCE NO. 2021-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGRAM, TEXAS AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF INGRAM, TEXAS, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 1.08; AND PROVIDING FOR THE FOLLOWING: FINDINGS OF FACT; ENACTMENT; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY; PUBLICATION; EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

WHEREAS, the City of Ingram, Texas (“City”) is a Type A general-law municipality incorporated and operating under the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Section 51.001, Texas Local Government Code, authorizes the City Council of the City of Ingram, Texas (“City Council”) to adopt ordinances for the good government, peace, and order of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council previously adopted reasonable regulations and rules for the use and occupancy of City parks; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend its ordinances regarding regulations and rules for the use and occupancy of City parks; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is of the opinion and finds that the amendment of these regulations will promote the public health, safety, or general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Ingram, as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

Section 2. Code Amended. Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article 1.08, Parks and Recreation of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingram, Texas is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1.08 PARKS AND RECREATION

Sec. 1.08.01 General Authority

The City of Ingram shall have and shall exercise the power to control all activities, hours of use, and days and times of opening City Parks to the public. All City Parks shall be under the direct supervision of the City Council or its authorized designee(s). The City’s Police Department shall supervise law and order in all areas of City Parks in order to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the public.

Sec. 1.08.02 Definitions

As used herein, the following terms have the meanings set out below:

City Park. Any area designated by the City Council as a park, whether currently so designated, or designated in the future. The term "City Park" includes not only the area used for recreation and other park purposes, it also includes all adjacent or nearby areas used for parking of vehicles.

Special Events. Planned gatherings in the City Park of 10 or more people, or which will utilize a pavilion, kitchen, or any other permanent structure or utilities located on the City Park property.

Sec. 1.08.03 Jumping or Diving

It shall be unlawful for any person within a City Park to jump or dive or do other dangerous act from trees, platforms, high banks, dams, or walkways along, or over a public property or right-of-way.

Sec. 1.08.04 Overnight Camping, Parking, etc.

It shall be unlawful within a City Park, without prior written approval, to do any of the following:

- a. Camp or remain in the City Park overnight;
- b. Park any portable building, camping unit or any type of motor vehicle overnight;
- c. Participate in or allow any equipment use or other activity between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Sec. 1.08.05 Vehicles

It shall be unlawful for any unauthorized person to do the following within a City Park:

- a. Drive any motor vehicle into, along or across any grassy area, except as designated by the City for special events; or
- b. Drive upon any hike or bike trail, footpath or footbridge.

This section's prohibition of motor vehicles in certain City Park areas is not applicable to wheelchairs or authorize vehicles being used strictly for the purpose of loading or unloading freight, or in the construction, maintenance or repair of said City Park and facilities, or vehicles with prior written approval from the Mayor or the Mayor's designee.

Section 1.08.06 Permit Required for Special Events

- a. **Permit.** Special Events to be held at a City Park during open hours of the City Park shall require a special events permit to be obtained from the Office of the City Secretary. Such permit shall be on a form provided by the City Secretary or her designee and shall only be issued to individual and/or organizations for family functions or events sponsored by a non-profit organization, as that term is defined by the United States Internal Revenue Tax Code.
- b. **Permit Fee for Park Pavilion.** The Special Event permit fee for use of the Park Pavilion located at 3283 Junction Highway shall be \$150 for use of the pavilion and restrooms and \$200 for use of the pavilion, restrooms, and electricity. This fee shall be paid in full at the time of reservation of the park facilities.

- c. **Deposit Required for Park Pavilion.** In addition to the permit fee, an applicant for a Special Event permit must also pay a security deposit of \$200, payable to the City of Ingram no later than the time arrangements are made to obtain the keys.
- d. **Permit Fee for Event Grounds.** The Special Event permit fee for use of the Event Grounds located at 107 Old Ingram Loop shall be \$250 per day and \$500 per day for electricity and water provided. This fee shall be paid in full at the time of reservation of the park facilities.
- e. **Deposit Required for Event Grounds.** In addition to the permit fee, an applicant for a Special Event permit must also pay a security deposit of \$250, payable to the City of Ingram no later than the time arrangements are made to obtain the keys.
- f. **Cleanup and Refund of Deposit.** The permittee shall be responsible for cleanup of all facilities used immediately following the event. After inspection and approval by City staff of the cleanup, the deposit will be refunded to the permittee. Any deductions for costs incurred by the City for damage to the City's property or failure to complete the required cleanup will be made before the deposit is refunded.
- g. **Waiver of Fee and Deposit for City Employees.** A person currently employed by the City as a full or part-time employee shall be exempt from the permit fee and deposit requirement.
- h. **Arrangements for Access to Park Facilities.** Permittee shall be responsible for arranging to obtain a key from the City Secretary's Office prior to the event. Permittee's failure to obtain the key during working hours or failure to keep an appointment to meet City staff to obtain the key outside of regular working hours may result in forfeiture of up to \$50 of the Permittee's deposit.
- i. **No fee will be refunded for cancellation less than two weeks before the event.**

Section 1.08.07 Littering Prohibited

All trash generated by use within the City Park area shall be removed from the City Park by the person bringing in the trash or generating said trash, unless trash containers in the City Park have sufficient capacity to hold such trash. It shall be unlawful for any person to do the following in a City Park:

- a. Pick up, tear, damage, or remove any tree, shrub, plant, vine, flower, or vegetation, dead or downed wood, except for scientific or educational purposes and with prior written consent from the City;
- b. Build any fire except in approved pits or rills of metal or masonry construction;
- c. Maintain noise and sound levels of groups, individuals, radios, or any sound equipment at a level annoying to other members of the public;
- d. Bring, use, carry, or dispose of any glass container;
- e. Throw, deposit, or place loose paper, cans, bottles, waste materials or rubbish or any kind in any area of the City Park, including the water or stream adjoining the City Park, except into an approved waste container intended as a receptacle for such material; or
- f. Dispose of household waste (not generated in the City Park) in any approved trash receptacle located in the City Park.

Section 1.08.08 Park Hours

The City Parks shall be open to the public during the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., except as provided hereinafter. The City Park shall be closed to the public from 11:01 p.m. until 5:59 a.m., and also as

otherwise closed by order of the City Council, or its authorized designee, including but not limited to the Chief of Police. Any eligible person may request a Special Event to use City Park facilities during hours that the City Park is usually closed. Whether a Special Event permit for use of City Park facilities outside of usual City Park hours will be granted is a decision that shall be within the sole discretion of the City.

Section 1.08.09 Unlawful to Remain in City Park When Closed

It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or remain in a City Park during hours when the City Park is closed without prior written consent from the City.

Section 1.08.10 Penalty

Any person who shall violate a provision of this Article, or fail to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction for such may be punished by a fine in accordance with the general penalty provided in Section 1.01.009 of this code for each violation. Each day of a continuing violation shall be considered a separate violation, and may be punished as such.

Section 3. Repealer Clause. All provisions of the ordinances of the City of Ingram in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and all other provisions of the ordinances of the City of Ingram not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Severability Clause. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances as a whole.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provide.

Section 6. Proper Notice and Meeting. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was adopted was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-5

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGRAM, TEXAS AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF INGRAM, TEXAS, CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 3.08; AND PROVIDING FOR THE FOLLOWING: FINDINGS OF FACT; ENACTMENT; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY; PUBLICATION; EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

WHEREAS, the City of Ingram, Texas ("City") is a Type A general-law municipality incorporated and operating under the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Section 51.001, Texas Local Government Code, authorizes the City Council of the City of Ingram, Texas ("City Council") to adopt ordinances for the good government, peace, and order of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council previously adopted reasonable regulations on fences within the City to protect and enhance property values, create a pleasing environment for residents and the entire community, and preserve the quality of life for City residents; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend its regulations regarding fences within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is of the opinion and finds that the amendment of these regulations will promote the public health, safety, or general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Ingram, as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

Section 2. Code Amended. Chapter 3, Building Regulations, Article 3.08, Fence Regulations, Section 3.08.02 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingram, Texas is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

Sec. 3.08.02 Information Needed for Permit

In order to acquire a permit a drawing of the property on which the fence is to be constructed must be submitted to the City for review and the drawing must contain the following information:

- a. Show all setback lines, property lines, and easements;
- b. Lot, block, street address and subdivision information if applicable;
- c. Proposed location of fence highlighted on the drawing;
- d. Show existing structures on the property; and
- e. A description of the fence (i.e. height, material, design)

Chapter 3, Building Regulations, Article 3.08, Fence Regulations, Section 3.08.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingram, Texas is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

Sec. 3.08.04 Construction Prohibited

No fence erected shall:

- a. Restrict the access to fire hydrants;
- b. Be constructed of broken concrete stacked in piles or rows, sheet/corrugated metal, fiberglass, plywood or other materials not manufactured or designed for the primary purpose of fence construction;
- c. Be constructed to restrict the visibility of a driver of a vehicle or be sight obscuring on a public road or easement; or
- d. Utilize razor wire.

Chapter 3, Building Regulations, Article 3.08, Fence Regulations, Section 3.08.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingram, Texas is hereby repealed and reserved for future use:

Sec. 3.08.06 [Reserved]

Chapter 3, Building Regulations, Article 3.08, Fence Regulations, Section 3.08.07 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ingram, Texas is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

Sec. 3.08.07 Maintenance

All fences shall be maintained reasonably plumb and structurally sound. Each structural and decorative member of a fence shall be free of deterioration.

Section 3. Repealer Clause. All provisions of the ordinances of the City of Ingram in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and all other provisions of the ordinances of the City of Ingram not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Severability Clause. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances as a whole.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provide.

Section 6. Proper Notice and Meeting. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was adopted was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.
